## JUNE'S TEAM LETTER:

Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms. (1 Peter 4:10)

I find it an enormous privilege as a priest to journey with people as they explore their vocation and God's call on their lives. Recently Pat Hendrickson and Brian Jolley from St. Margaret's, Reydon have offered themselves for different ministries within God's Church. (Pat as an Ordained Local Minister and Brian as a Reader). Both are in the selection process of the Diocese and national Church and I commend them both to your prayers at this time.

In the Bible we're constantly reminded of God's calling

to individuals to exercise a variety of ministries and gifts. Vocation is not just a term for those to be ordained to the Clergy, for each one of us has a calling from God to use our gifts and talents in His service and for the building up of the Christian Fellowship. Some are blessed with a gift for hospitality or welcoming; some in administration or finance; some with the ability to work with young people; some with dreaming dreams and others with the gift of helping turn dreams into reality. All of us have a part to play in building up the Body of Christ in this place, working together in mission and ministry.

We each have a part to play as together, guided by the Holy Spirit we are better able to

witness God's saving love for all people. Archbishop Rowan writes:

*In the most general sense, vocation is God's summons into existence itself. God calls creation into being; everything that is made is called and named; its identity lies in the purposive call of God. But for the Christian, this is more specific again: human beings are called to grow in community into the likeness of Jesus Christ. Their vocation is not just to exist, but to come into a life that shares in Christ's life. The Church's very name (ekklesia) means 'a community that is called together'; but the Church is not only a called community, it is a community that represents God's call and invitation to all humanity. Archbishop Rowan Williams in 'The Way Ahead'*

Can I encourage you to set aside a little time this month to draw near to God and seek how He wants you to use the skills and gifts you have, praying that God will inspire, enliven and empower us, so that we may be sustained by the life of Christ in ourselves, in one another and in the world.

# RURAL DEAN APPOINTMENT

It was with a certain degree of surprise that I have accepted the Bishop's invitation to become the next Rural Dean. As I expect you are already aware our current Rural Dean, Paul Nelson, is stepping aside at the end of June, and I have been asked to take up the reins from the beginning of July.

The biggest immediate challenge is to complete the merger of the Halesworth and Beccles deaneries into one. At our last deanery synod meetings both deaneries voted in favour of a permanent merger, so this now needs to be implemented in a way that makes sense and that is helpful to all our combined 56 parishes.

Happily it is recognised that

being Rural Dean is quite a responsibility and therefore an assistant Rural Dean has also been appointed. I am delighted that Rich Henderson will be working with me in that capacity. I know that his support will be invaluable, and I am grateful to him for taking on the role. We also need to appoint a Lay Chair, and we look forward to finding the right person to fill that position.

The role of the Rural Dean is to care for the clergy within the deanery, and in a practical sense this means planning a programme of regular chapter meetings that facilitate a measure of friendship, mutual support and sometimes training. Also, the Rural Dean cares for parishes that

are in interregnum. The Rural Dean works with the Archdeacon and Bishops in facilitating a two way process of communication between them and clergy and parishes.

There are three Deanery Synod meetings a year in which the local church gathers through its representatives to share together and encourage each other in our shared mission and ministry, and the Rural Dean chairs these meetings.

I will be licensed as Rural Dean at a special service at Holy Trinity Blythburgh on Sunday 3rd July at 6pm to which everyone is warmly invited. I will certainly value your friendship, support and prayers as we go forward into God's future together.

Are gardeners ever satisfied? Since my last report we have had glorious sunshine and warm (for the most part) winds, but oh! how my garden and allotment are crying out for rain! Not too much, of course and preferably during darkness so we can still get out to enjoy the lovely weather.

Suffering most are the ericaceous plants in pots which should not be watered with tap water. A small hint if, like mine, your water butt is dry. Defrost the fridge/freezer and use that water, brought to room temperature, for your azaleas, acers, blueberries and other acid-loving specimens. Now is the time to start regular feeding and weeding, but don't be too hasty in planting out

those tender seedlings as frosts may still be lurking round the corner ready to nip your young vegetables and hanging baskets.

## A Rare Opportunity to see Sibton Abbey

A rare opportunity to view the ruins of Sibton Abbey will take place on the last weekend in June. The ruins of the Abbey were last open to the public in 2003, and on Saturday 25th and Sunday 26th June the charity The Friends of St Peters will be opening them again, with the kind permission of the owner. This is Suffolk's only Cistercian Abbey and nestles in the valley of the Yox, almost opposite Sibton church.

Opening times are from 10.30am to 4pm both days and entry tickets are £5 adults, £2.50 children age 5-16 years old, and under 5's free, available on the gate. No dogs are allowed and visitors are asked to wear sensible shoes. The ruins are not suitable for wheelchair access.

Parking for the Abbey Ruins is on the field opposite Abbey Farm on the A1120, midway between Sibton Church and Sibton Nursery School (the old primary school). At the same times as the Abbey Ruins will be open there will be a display of local history in the church, and refreshments will be served there, including Cream Teas. Parking for the church will be on the glebe meadow the Yoxford side of the church.

# BOOK CLUB

**A**t our May meeting we discussed Sarah Dunant's "Scared Hearts". Most people agreed this was an excellent book and enjoyed the direct, descriptive writing style with well drawn characters. The setting was convent life in 16th century Italy. The main character and novice nun, Serafina, came from a good family but there wasn't sufficient dowry for two daughters so one had to go the convent. The subjugation of young women conversely provided freedom for many. For example, Zuana wanted to be a doctor but could not do so in the outside world but in the convent

she ran the dispensary and practised medicine. Serafina on the other hand was angry and resentful, particularly as she had a relationship with a singing teacher which her parents forbade. The constraints of the cells, the relentless programme of prayer (including a session at 2 a.m.) and subsequent sleep deprivation, the control of the Abbess and the knowledge that she would live there all her days were too much for Serafina. She attempted one escape which failed and the hopelessness of her situation made her control her eating by fasting. One person said that the whole book was suffocating

and uncomfortable. Another member found the old nun with a belt of nails around her waist grotesque. The power struggles and business-like set up of the convent was very interesting and we all agreed that the ending was not quite believable and we doubted that a novice nun would be able to leave in the manner of Serafina's departure. In summary, very well written and researched and highly recommended.

We next meet on Thursday 9th June to discuss 'Burnt Shadows' by Kamila Shamsie. All welcome. Tea/coffee £1
