## An easy way to support Wangford Church Repair Fund

As we come up to the festive period, many of us will use the convenience and ease of internet shopping to purchase gifts. You are now able to help the Wangford Church Appeal to raise funds every time you internet shop and it costs you nothing.

Easyfundraising.org.uk is an organisation which will pay a percentage of your shop directly to a charity/cause. There are over 400 retail sites which are affiliated including Ebay, John Lewis, Amazon, insurance companies, etc.

Below is a guide to how to set yourself up and start raising free funds for the Church. The first time you will need to register with an Email address and give yourself a password. After this it is easy.

To register go onto the [easyfundraising.org.uk](http://easyfundraising.org.uk) site – Register now – Support a Cause (put in Wangford Church Repair Fund), then the screen changes and you enter your details. Once you have registered follow the following steps each time you wish to purchase something.

1. Sign in with your Email address and password.
2. Go to AtoZ of retailers and find the online store you want to shop with.
3. Choose 'go shopping'; the retailer's web page will automatically open.
4. Shop just as normal.
5. Wangford Church gets a percentage of your shop at no cost to you.

Once you have joined the supporters of Wangford Church Repair Fund, you will be able to see your contributions and the total amount raised for the Church. To date we have just 13 members and only six of these have raised an incredible £54.00.

## FEBRUARY'S TEAM LETTER:

Dear Friends

As I write to you in the aftermath of all our Christmas festivities, family travels, New Year resolutions and a new school term, I wonder what remains in your minds from this time. For some of us it is a relief when life returns to normal, for others this may be a time of the start of a new job or a new project, for others in this community this time has brought loss and pain, even more difficult when everybody around us seems to be in celebratory mood.

What keeps coming back to me are the well known words from the carol "O come all ye faithful" which ends "O come, let us adore Him". At Christmas we are encouraged to stop at the manger and adore the new born baby – not a difficult thing to do when we take part in the joy of a new family. What is more challenging is to continue our

adoration when that special infant grows up, begins his ministry, engages with all the issues of being human, gives up his life that we may live fully and abundantly and invites us to do the same. To adore is to give someone our full attention from the heart, that place from which prayer instinctively arises (the Latin root means "to pray towards"). This is a time of huge change worldwide, in the economic and financial trading systems, with the rising influence of China and massive change in the Arab world, even possibly within our own United Kingdom, and we will all be affected by this sooner or later. What we undertake at local level, can step by step make a difference to the larger picture. So let's make time to "Come and adore him" and in so doing, discover just a little bit more about the Saviour who outgrew his manger and even now lives amongst us.
